

Overview of Virtual Education



- Pre-pandemic, 298,000 students in the United States were enrolled in full-time virtual schools (National Education Policy Center, "Virtual Schools in the U.S.
 2019: Executive Summary," May 2019)
- As of 2019, 33 states had statewide fully online schools.
- Models of virtual schools include statewide virtual schools, multi-district, singledistrict or consortium schools.
- California has several charter online schools including California Virtual Academies, Insight Schools, and Connections Academy.
- Senate Bill 98 (emergency distance learning) is no longer in effect.
- Assembly Bill 130 helps transition schools from virtual learning during the pandemic year to post-pandemic distance learning and virtual options.
- AB 130 further defines how virtual learning and attendance looks in the online environment.











2021-22 Highlights

Next Steps

- Continue to enroll new students
- Make staffing adjustments
- File for WASC accreditation (HS only)
- Adjust and modify courses offerings and course content
- Structure student academic schedules to ensure synchronous and asynchronous instructional minutes are appropriate and balanced
- Address the social- emotional needs of students who are coming with anxiety and wellness challenges
